They will expose which ecosystems are damaged, also they will explain without reading, which endemic species are endangered.

Rubric

Information	The project needs to have name of the student, the name of the disaster and some activities that causes this problem.
Neatness	The work is clean and clear.
Handwriting	The written text can be understood.
Spelling	Words are written correctly.
Presentation	Students explain the causes of the chosen natural disaster, the ecosystem that are damaged and the endangered species.
Materials	The work has been made with the asked materials.
